Dear Mr. McKean,

Thank you for the opportunity to submit this proposal to provide GPS survey services for the subject project. This proposal discusses our understanding of the project, recommends a scope of services together with associated fees, deliverables and approximate schedules, sets forth our assumptions and discusses other services that may be of interest as the project proceeds.

Project Understanding

We understand that tracking water level changes in groundwater is a requirement for Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs) as part of SGMA compliance. In addition to depth to water measurements, regional groundwater mapping efforts rely on elevation data from each well site to create a unified groundwater surface across the entire Kings Subbasin. The network of monitored wells spans multiple water agencies and accuracy of elevation data at each well site varies between agencies and even within an agency service area. In order to improve the accuracy of quantitative summaries and create a comprehensive data set for the entire subbasin, verified reference elevations at each well site should be obtained. For sites where the source and vertical datum of Reference Point and Ground Surface elevations are questionable, acquiring accurate elevations with survey grade GPS equipment is necessary.

Scope of Services

Our proposed scope of work for this proposal is a single phase, described below.

Phase GPS: Groundwater Well GPS Survey

Well sites within the North Fork Kings GSA that are visited seasonally (Spring/Fall) for groundwater measurements will be visited for this project if verifiable elevation data is not available from a previous GPS survey. P&P staff will travel to each well with a representative from a Water Agency that is the typical measuring Agency for those wells. For this survey wells measured by Department of Water Resources, Laguna Irrigation District, Liberty Water District, Riverdale PUD, and US Bureau of Reclamation are included. Our estimate for the GSA is that

70 wells currently being monitored for water levels need to be surveyed (DWR - 4, LID - 28, LWD - 33, RPUD - 1, USBR - 4).

- Each well will have the following data collected by a surveyor
 - Well name (local agency name)
 - One photo of the well and immediately surrounding area
 - Elevation shot of a 'hard' surface at the well site as close to the center of the well as possible. This may be the edge of exposed well casing or top of the concrete pad supporting the pump, for example.
 - Measured distance from the survey shot to the reference point (access point for the water level measurement) and to the adjacent natural ground. The reference point used when collecting water level measurements will be confirmed with the Water Agency representative on site.
 - Power source for the well pump (electric, natural gas, diesel).
 - Classification for whether the well appears to be an actively producing well or not
- P&P will use the collected elevations and measurements to calculate a Reference Point Elevation and Ground Surface Elevation for each well site to use in GIS for seasonal groundwater contour creation and storage change calculations.
- A survey summary will be created for the GSA showing surveyed wells for each participating Water Agency, site photo, and elevations.
- Elevations will be in feet, vertical datum NAVD88.
- Up to 9 regional control points will also be surveyed for elevation as a cross-check.

Professional Fees

Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group will perform the services in this Phase on a time and materials basis, in accordance with our Standard Fee Schedule in effect at the time services are rendered. For budgeting purposes, our preliminary estimate is that over the next 4 months, our fees will be \$ 12,000 to \$ 17,000. These fees will be invoiced monthly as they are accrued. Reimbursable expenses will be invoiced in addition to professional fees and are included in the estimated ranges above. If it appears we will need to exceed the upper range above, we will notify you in writing before we do so and will provide a revised estimate. We will not continue work beyond the initial budget without additional authorization.

If the scope changes materially from that described above, as a result of any agency's decision or because of lack of access or difficulty locating wells during the survey, we will prepare a revised estimate of our fees for your approval before we proceed.

Schedule

Once we receive an executed copy of this Proposal that will serve as our notice to proceed, we can begin to coordinate with the participating Water Agencies to schedule visits to their well sites. Survey data will be collected as quickly as reasonably possible, but it is anticipated to take several months for coordination and to collect all the necessary data.

Assumptions

• GSA will initiate contact between designated field personnel from each participating Water Agencies, and provide contact information to P&P.

 A local Water Agency representative is required to lead P&P field staff to each well site and provide access through any locked gates. If sites require pre-planning for coordination with private landowners, Water Agency staff will coordinate as needed independently so site visits are efficient.

Additional Services

The following services are not included in this proposal, however these and others can be provided at additional cost, upon request.

• Extra work caused by delays beyond Consultant's reasonable control by reason of strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns or stoppages, accidents, acts of God, failure of Client to furnish timely information or approve or disapprove of Consultant's services or instruments of service promptly, or faulty performance by Client or other contractors or governmental agencies.

Terms and Conditions

If this proposal is acceptable, please sign and return a copy to our office. Authorization will serve as our Notice to Proceed. Upon authorization this proposal will become an attachment to the existing Consulting Services Agreement ("Agreement") executed between North Fork Kings Groundwater Sustainability Agency and Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group on September 6, 2017. This proposal is valid for 30 days from the date above.
